LOCATON - THE REMEDY GROUP TRAINING ROOM – 172 Main St, Lilydale (3 minutes from Lilydale train station)

TIMES

- All clinics are held on Fridays – once per month
- **1PM TILL 7PM**
- One or two new patients and four to six follow ups

COST OF CLINICS

- Single clinic - \$75 per clinic
- Discount – where 3 clinics are attended in a row – the fourth will receive a discount of \$20
- Cpd points will apply for professional practitioners

Payment for clinic is requested in advance (cheque, credit card or internet banking – no refunds where less than three days notice of cancellation is given) – contact college admin@vcch.org for details

BOOKINGS ARE ESSENTIAL – contact the college by email admin@vcch.org or ring 9873 0567 and leave your details.

- All cases are shown live
- Each case has a full miasmatic facial analysis
- Each case has a full case analysis with discussion on case management
- All cases are asked to return for a minimum of four appointments
- If a patient doesn't show up the time will be allocated to discussion on facial analysis and/or assistance will be given to your current cases (please get patients permission first)

CLINIC DESIGN – Observers will be seated in the classroom whilst the patient will be in the consultation office and live video will be relayed to the group. Please arrive on time and if you happen to be late step into the room quietly and take a seat at the side. Cases will be taken by either Grant or Louise and usually take an hour or more – follow ups 15 to 20 minutes. Each case will be videoed to enable further analysis in training seminars. Patients will be known by their first name with their surname, address and phone number only made available to the college staff. Students and practitioners are asked to remain quiet and respect that the patients have placed themselves in a vulnerable position by having personal details of their lives shared in front of a group whilst being videoed. When the case has finished the patient will be asked to wait in the waiting room.

STUDENT/PRACTITIONER INPUT – During the case taking observers may take their own notes as to what aspects of the case are important. While the patient waits the group chooses the rubrics for the case. The group will also assess the dominant miasm by facial analysis. Once the rubrics are completed the case will be repertorised and the group will discuss remedies to be chosen and choice of potency and frequency of dose.

MEAL BREAKS – The timing of these clinics allows for lunch before and dinner after – a short break will be factored in during the mid afternoon where possible. Coffee/tea/water is supplied by the college.

PATIENTS – The clinic relies on students helping to find patients for the clinic. All patients are asked to ring the college where they will be informed about the case-taking process and an appointment arranged. We will take any case but if you know the patient personally they will be asked if they are happy to have you present – if they aren't happy you will be asked to sit out during that consultation.

MOBILES PHONES – must be turned off during student clinic as they will interfere with the images and sound. Make sure they are turned off (not just silent).
